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

# The Case Method



- **The case method believe that “experience” is the best teacher for many managerial lessons**
- **Use cases to simulate the managerial work experience as closely as possible**
- **The case method increases the student’s experience base**

# Four Steps of the Case Method



- Step 1: individual analysis
- Step 2: learning team meeting
- **Step 3: class discussion**
- Step 4: reflection and integration

- **2P's: Prepare and Participate**
  - i Cases
  - i Course materials

# Role of Instructor



## — Lead a class discussion

- i Sequence of Topics

- i Transition to new Topics

- ÷ Create climate that lets participants try out ideas

- ÷ Provide clarification of issues

- ÷ Provide knowledge or information if missing
